THE LANSDOWNE HALL

Additional Comments and Notes in support of the application by the Lansdowne Hall Management Committee to be awarded funding towards the cost of supplying and installing a Basketball Sure Shot Long Reach Gladiator In Ground Unit on its Multi Sports Pitch.

History and Background Information.

This goes back sometime before any of the current Management Committee Members were in office when in conjunction with the Chapel Street development the Bowood Estate and C G Fry and Sons Ltd allocated a sum of money to cover various improvements to the Lansdowne Hall's facilities. This included the laying of all weather Multi use sports pitch and it is understood that at the time it was suggested that this be administered by the Parish Council. However the Parish Council was not keen on this idea and the then Hall's Managemnt Committee took on the responsibility of running the pitch on behalf of the local Community. A range of sports were considered including Basketball and funding was initially sought from the Landfill Tax Credit scheme towards the cost of line marking, netball equipment, tennis nets and support posts, boarding around the pitch and a storage shed. Sufficient fund were raised and the pitch came into use in about 2010. Since then the Hall's Management Committee has continued to administer and maintain the pitch, sometimes at considerable costs and has now been asked to include a Basketball facility.

2. Community Benefits, Need & Demand

From the outset there has always been the intention (and several discussion have taken place) to add Basketball to the activities but it was thought this would be liable to interfere with Netball and it was impracticable to install two fixed basketball goals. However we became aware that there were a number of Basketball fanatics in Derry Hill and the surrounding area and this particularly came to light when we sought ideas on how best to utilise the Multi Pitch in the Inspire Parish Magazine. This resulted in an e-mail dated 9th May from Colin Herring (an international Basketball Coach) a copy is attached to this application package which is self explanatory in supporting this funding application.

In addition an e-mail dated 29th June (copy enclosed) has been received from George Godwin also supporting our application with an emphasise on youth participation and pointing out the lack of such facilities in the area.

Also at the recent Derry Hill and Studley Village Fete Calne Saints supported the Fete with a Basketball stand which received a lot of interest.

3. Funding Being Sought and Ongoing Maintenance.

The main immediate cost of the project will be the purchase of the unit (otherwise known as the ring), a picture of which can be found on page 3 of the attachment to Colin Herrings e-main and priced at £2,465.99 plus the Ground Sleeve at £250.99 on page 4.

This is the recommended Ring and the most suitable and durable for use in open spaces besides being approved by Basketball England. It has been designed to survive in any environment and comes with an 8 year anti-rust warranty. Please see page 5.

The Basketball England price seemed expensive and investigation found three cheaper potential suppliers, the cheapest being Sportserve Ltd at £2,077.20, including delivery. This ring is not currently in stock but can be obtained within a 6-8 week lead time and the supplier has confirmed that this price will remain good for delivery up to the end of October. This should fit in with our time scales. In addition to this there will be the cost of installing the Ring into the ground and we have extracted one quote for this work at £978 and are expecting another one soon for comparison purposes but with the delivery lead time in mind installation will not be until the end of October. As already mention the Hall will cover any maintenance and ware and tear cost associated with the Ring and the pitch in general together with cost of any pitch markings considered necessary which could be in the region of £250. Regarding the marking, which will facilitate the introduction of 3 v 3 competitions that can be played on half a court (hence the need for only one ring) will be reviewed once the facility is up and running. It is hoped that 3 v 3 will prove popular and its inclusions in the Commonwealth Games should create a lot of interest.

In conclusion the Hall is hoping for a £2,000 grant from the Parish Council and is willing to pick up the installation costs, the £77.20, the eventual pitch marking costs and all ongoing maintenance cost.

4. Neighbourhood Plan.

This application identifies the delivery of a specific Community facility which will cater for all ages and abilities in an open air and healthy environment. Such facilities are in short supply in the area but it has been noted that a number of properties in Derry Hill and Studley have Basketball stands or rings attached to walls or garages and the opportunity to use the real thing in the Multi Pitch would be a godsend.

5. Project Management, Risk and Measuring Benefits.

Once installed the use of the ring will be managed and monitored by the Lansdowne Hall's Management Committee and its administrator with advice and assistance from Calne Saints Basketball Club qualified coaches. Calne Saints use the Lansdowne Arms as their Club headquarters (one of their members is now the new Landlord) and the Management Committee will meet regularly with them to review progress.

A booking system will be applied for Club / organised activities to avoid a clash of events and the same will apply to individuals or small groups wanting to practice their skills. Calne Saints no doubt have their own Club insurance and it will be made clear to casual user that they use the facility at their own risk

6. Closing Remarks

All evidence suggests that this will be a welcomed and well used facility fulfilling a shortfall of such facilities in the area. It is therefore hoped that the Calne Without Parish Council feel able to support this project in a favourable manner.

Dear Alan,

I hope you don't mind me emailing? I spoke to John in the Lansdowne Arms on Friday and he showed me your email to him regarding the basketball posts for the multi play area in the village.

I moved into the village nearly two years ago and was very impressed with the fact that the village has a fantastic village hall and outdoor play area. I also saw great potential for basketball rings being installed. They are great for individuals as they can be used alone, which is difficult in other sports and they have great potential for both competitive and social use by larger numbers.

Personally, I have been involved in basketball coaching for many years including 25 plus years working for Mini Basketball England and coaching youths locally, nationally and internationally. In that time I have gained quite a bit of experience regarding equipment and the needs of all types of players.

My son who until recently lived with us in Church road followed in my footsteps and runs the Calne Saints basketball club who play in the West of England Basketball league.

By coincidence the team consists of a large number of players (7 out of 14) from Derry Hill, including Matt (Landlord of the Lansdowne Arms) and Aaron who is one of managers.

Not only does the team play competitively - the players also like to be involved in the community. Last year they made wooden reindeers which were sold and the funds donated to the local food bank.

The team also like to support the events Matt puts on at the pub and they also encourage younger players to

One player, George Godwin (former Derry Hill postman) runs junior coaching sessions in Calne as well.

I'm sure that if asked they would support events in the village to help raise finds for the school and rub a dubs, where I have grandchildren and for the village hall itself.

Last summer and during the pandemic when sports facilities limited the number of players who could use facilities many of the team members travelled to Holt near Bradford on Avon where they used an outdoor facility similar to the one in the village to play basketball on their rings.

I'm sure that if there were basketball posts available in the village they would get a lot of use as they were going to Holt at least once or twice a week.

I've had a look at the area and think that it would be feasible to put basketball posts in the area without interfering with the netball playing area and the football goals at the ends of the court.

The posts can be sunk into the ground on the outside of the court and would then overhang the fence into the playing area. Purchasing extended arm units would make it safer for the players as they move towards the

In various conversations with John we discussed what type of basketball unit would be best to install. Many outdoor areas/parks install basic units that do not last long as the giants in the game tend to hang on the rings if they can. So, if units were purchased I would recommend that a bit extra is spent to obtain the vandal proof units that are often used in basketball courts in the USA etc.


If baskets were to be installed, not only would the club members be keen to use them for training etc they would also offer coaching sessions to youngsters and organise 3 v 3 tournaments which would involve hiring the kitchen facilities as well so increasing income for the village. We could offer the coaching sessions free of charge to youngsters or make a small fee that would then go towards the village hall funds.

I don't know if John has mentioned that I have already done some research on costs (attached). One of my friends runs a sports company and is able to obtain the baskets that are the ones approved/recommended by Basketball England, but with a possibility of a discounted price through the suppliers representative.

Dear Alan,

We have had many a brief discussion over the past few years regarding a good quality Basketball unit on the multi sport pitch at the village hall in Derry Hill.

As you know we currently use the multi sport pitch for Netball most weeks and have a very good turn out of anything between 15 and 30 players many who live in the village. The surface is perfect and because of how it is situated behind the village hall it is sheltered from the wind making for a good playing environment for both Basketball and Netball.

Being a local Coach I am heavily involved in Basketball and Netball. Locally, there is a distinct lack of facilities for both. Basketball is an extremely expensive sport to play, I am part of Calne Saints Basketball club, many of our players live in the village and when the weather suits I believe many would use such a facility. I run a junior basketball club on Mondays at Calne leisure centre and such a facility would enable us to run tournaments in Warmer Months and possibly on Weekend mornings.

Indoor Hall hire is a huge cost to all Basketball clubs and other options offer a great alternative.

Please keep us updated on any developments on this, we hope it is a possibility.
