### **Editorial**

Welcome to the combined December/January issue. It seems right to look back on the past year and to what might lie ahead. When writing this piece for the December 2019/January 2020 issue, Covid 19 was just a local issue in China and there was little to warn us of the turmoil which was to hit the country within a matter of weeks. This time last year things were beginning to look more hopeful and there was the distinct prospect of fewer restrictions and health issues in 2022.

Such hopes were dashed fairly early in the year with the Russian invasion of Ukraine. While some experts might have foreseen some conflict as inevitable, I doubt that many would have predicted the almost immediate levels of economic chaos which would afflict the world so quickly. Concerns about Covid 19 (which is still with us) were replaced by anxieties over significant rises in the cost of fuel and of the impact of the loss of Russian gas supplies (of which this country used very little) on our electricity and heating prices. Government expenditure on support during Covid and in connection with energy costs has to repaid and that is about to be dealt with, probably by tax increases and spending cuts. Certain other government actions have exacerbated the situation. So, we leave behind a very unpredictable year which highlights that we are all so dependent on world events than we have ever been. The coming year will not be easy, but we hope for the best, in particular some sort of resolution in Ukraine

2022 saw a sunny and hot couple of months, masking the months of severely reduced rainfall. Lawns turned brown, hosepipe bans were introduced, and nature began to suffer. It has since recovered, though water levels remain low, and that gives us



hope. We still have distinct seasons to enjoy, and we enter the winter months where nature offers a stark beauty with trees and fields stripped back to basic structures, highlighted by a low sun and maybe some crisp, clear days. Enjoy the season and of course we have the delights of the Christmas and New Year festivities to look forward to.

### Dear Friends,

By the time you read this the Advent season will have begun, the first candle on the Advent wreath having been lit on 27th November. Every year my intention is to try to find some space during the Advent season to be still, to experience fully the sense of stillness gradually giving way to expectation; the quiet inner preparation is important to me. Inevitably the reality is that I get swept up in expectations and preparations which are more practical than spiritual and it can feel as if Christmas 'cheer' tramples all over Advent; when the wonder and hope of the coming Christ-child gets lost in the business of the rota of services. Or you might like to sign up to "The Visual Commentary on Scripture (VCS)". Liz Roberts, one of our Lay Pastoral Assistants (LPA) in Calne writes: "The VCS is a fascinating resource developed by King's College London with a team of theologians, art historians and Biblical scholars. gathered Various curators have three different artworks commentaries from a variety of viewpoints and voices to illustrate Biblical passages. The artworks help to give a fresh insight and challenge to the way we look at a familiar story. The material is freely accessible to view online (not to be printed due to copyright rules). During December, there will be a VCS advent calendar where a different angel-themed artwork will be delivered to your in-box every day. The website address is https://thevcs.org/ "

May I encourage you to savour all that the Advent season has to offer in terms of spiritual nourishment as we prepare our hearts for the coming of the Christ-child?

### The Night Sky in December and January

The next couple of months offers plenty of opportunities to view our celestial neighbours, aided by the longer and darker evenings. Later in December Venus reappears in our evening skies, and will be with us for some time, shining



brilliantly towards month end before setting around 17.30h. Jupiter has been with us for some months and continues to illuminate the southern evening skies before setting around midnight. The evenings of 28 and 29 December will see the Moon located close to the gas giant at around 18.00h. The same sort of picture will be painted on the evenings of 25 and 26 January.

Mars will be particularly impressive looking towards the south-eastern sky and is visible all night. It reaches its closest point to Earth since October 2020 on 1 December at around 81m km away. A week later Mars lies directly opposite the Sun and on 8 December the Moon passes in front of the red planet – a rare planetary occultation. This is visible from the UK starting at around 04.55h with the planet reappearing an hour later. It may be worth viewing as it is the first occultation of Mars visible from this country since 1952 with the next one not due until 2052. On 3 January at around 22.00h, Mars will be easily identifiable very close to the top of the Moon.

At around 16.45h on Christmas Day, brilliant Venus, low in the south-western sky, will have rocky Mercury just above and to its left with the thin crescent Moon a little further to the left. Above the Moon and further to the left, Saturn can be located.

21 December at 21.48h sees the Winter Solstice, giving us the shortest day (7h. 50min. 36secs in our part of the world) and the longest night of the year. Earth will be at perihelion, its closest point to the sun in its orbit, at 16.17h on 4 January.

### **Calne Without Parish Council**

### What we've been doing in the last month

On October 18<sup>th</sup>, 2022, Wiltshire considered and approved the recommendations from the Community Governance review that was looking at the boundaries of Calne Without Parish Council and neighbouring parishes.

This will be submitted to the Local Government Boundary Commission for England to seek their consent for the changes. If approved, they will come into effect in May 2025.

As you will have seen from the consultation, the boundaries of Calne Without Parish Council will be redrawn, with parts of the current parish moving into neighbouring Town/ Parish Council areas. The remaining part of Calne Without will be renamed Derry Hill and Studley Parish Council. We will keep you informed as we get more information.

### **Thermal imaging Camera Scheme**

We are still waiting for the outside temperature to drop low enough for us to launch our Thermal Imaging Camera scheme. The Council has purchased two thermal imaging camera, which we'll be loaning out for free to residents. These cameras enable users to identify the colds spots in their homes, where they're losing the most heat.

### Calne Community Neighbourhood Plan Review Update

The Steering Group are working hard to take forward all the information that has been gathered through the consultations during the summer and early autumn.

The long list of buildings identified in the Local Heritage Asset consultation, (72!) is being refined against the criteria for designation and owners will be contacted shortly.



"Bowood style" houses have also been identified through this process and will be mapped as part of the background information for the ongoing work on the Plan's Design Guide.

We had good feedback from the community and Landowners about potential Local Green Spaces. The final list of spaces that we can protect through this strong designation in our Neighbourhood Plan is being refined that will be shared back with the community in the new year.

The technical Housing Needs Assessment by consultants Aecom which will provide data to underpin the Plan's housing policies has been completed and will be available on the Neighbourhood Plan website for anyone that wishes to read it.

The "call for sites" period has finished, and the Group has received information on a number of sites put forward as available for housing and employment development. These will be referred to independent consultants for technical evaluation and advice on what further information or investigation is required before being considered by the Town and Parish Council.

### **Get A Defib While You Are Waiting**

If you phone 999 in an emergency these days they may well tell you to go get a Defib while you are waiting for an Ambulance to arrive, because the 999 service is under severe pressure and response times are getting longer.



If you live in Derry Hill or Studley, you are lucky because we have 5 Defibs available and we need to raise enough money for a sixth unit for a position on Old Road (Rag Lane) to complete our coverage across the villages. Each unit costs £2,500 to buy and install, and about £120 a year to maintain (that's new pads every 2 years or so, and a new battery every 4 years).

So, I want to ask all villagers to see it they can help us get that extra defib and keep our existing units running. Maybe you can join our team (just a few hours a year) or make a regular annual standing order payment of just £5 to:

This is so important if you want us to keep Derry Hill and Studley well covered for emergencies. By the way the November CPR and Defib training session at the Lansdowne Hall was a great success and we will arrange the next one with our village Paramedic next year.

### The Lansdowne Hall and basketball

A previous article in inSPIRE sought reader's views on how to increase the use of the Hall's Multi Sports Pitch and feedback has indicated that there were a number of basketball enthusiasts living in Derry Hill and the surrounding area. These enthusiasts included an international coach, The Calne



Saints Basketball Club (many whose members live in Derry Hill) and the running of junior coaching sessions.

The Multi Pitch is ideally positioned to provide basketball training and coaching besides being able to accommodate the up and coming 3 v 3 version of the game. With this potential in mind, a request, with supporting details, was made to the Parish Council for a grant towards the cost and installation of a basketball goal (otherwise known as a Ring). This request was successful and the Hall's Management Committee thanks the Parish Council for their support in this venture.

### **Neighbourhood Policing update**

CCTV van deployed to Church Road in Derry Hill due to diversion concerns.



The mobile police CCTV van was deployed to the area of Church Road in Derry Hill recently due to concerns raised by residents that vehicles were travelling too fast through the Village.

### Rise in residential burglaries

We are currently seeing a slight increase in residential burglaries in the Calne, Heddington, Hilmarton and Chippenham areas in recent weeks. Items being targeted in these burglaries have been that of high value gold and jewellery items. We have also seen a rise in electric bikes and motocross style



motorcycles being targeting in our area. As we approach the festive season, gifts and other items may also be targeted.

#### Please ensure to:

- lock windows and doors, even when at home.
- Ensure any alarms and/or CCTV are working properly. Doorbell cameras are a great investment.
- Using a property marking kit. This sometimes can lead to the recovery of stolen items
- Use a time switch on internal lights when not in at home
- Keep an inventory/take photos of valuable items

 Consider storing valuables out of sight and securely elsewhere when not in use.






### **Book Club Review**

'The Lincoln Highway' by Amor Towles. Chosen by Tanya

This author wrote 'A Gentleman in Moscow', a novel we read back in 2019 and which we all loved reading due to the beautiful writing and wonderful characterisation.

Would 'The Lincoln Highway 'match up?

The novel opens in 1954 as the 18-year-old Emmett Watson is being driven through the mid-west by a prison warden. He has been released on compassionate grounds after serving a little over a year for hitting a boy who had mocked his sickly father. His opponent had fallen against a kerb



and died, and Emmett was sent to a juvenile reform programme on a farm in Kansas. His father has died and the family farm has been seized by the bank, he must work out how to take care of himself and his precocious young brother. Unbeknown to Emmett, Duchess and Woolly, also from the reform programme, hide in the boot of the car and, once the warden has gone, reveal themselves to Emmett.

Emmett has plans to go to California to attempt to find his long-lost mother, heading down the Lincoln Highway, America's oldest coast to coast road. But the two friends have hatched an altogether different plan for Emmett's future.

This is a journey about three teenage boys, who are well meaning but flawed, trying to do the right thing. Towles' storytelling is superb, the characters are intimately observed and the writing is beautifully crafted.

Our book club was not disappointed. We all loved it!

### Forest Gate solar farm redesign



Eden Renewables has made some major design changes to reduce the size of the solar farm and height of the panels, which will substantially reduce its visual impact.

The four most easterly fields have been removed from the project completely, reducing the overall area by 22%. Instead of using panels which track the sun, fixed-tilt panels will be installed, facing south, which are 14% lower in height.

By changing the technology, we have been able to maintain the installed capacity of the solar farm at 49.9 Megawatts. It will produce enough power for the equivalent of 13,300 homes and save 19,000 tonnes of CO2 per year compared to energy from gas. The war in Ukraine has highlighted the need to reduce our dependence on gas, and solar power is now 1/9th the cost of gas generation.

The new permissive footpath around the site will follow the new boundary; and our community benefits package is unchanged, with over £800,000 expected to go back into the community over the life of the project. This will be boosted further by the opportunity for shared ownership/community investment through Zero Chippenham/ Zero North Wiltshire; surplus revenues would be used to provide fair access to solar, energy efficiency and EVs for local people, and other long-term environmental benefits.

### **The Lysley Family and Pewsham House**



Pewsham House stands on land that was once part of Pewsham Forest.

Beginning at Lacock Bridge, the Forest boundary is reported to have stretched along the River Avon to Chippenham, around the north of the town to the Marden River. The Marden was the boundary past Stanley Abbey up to Studley and then to Bowood. A line then ran along Sandy Lane to the road leading to Bowden and back to Lacock Bridge. It was not all forest, but included large tracts of heath land, valuable for pasturing cattle, and many acres of meadows along the watercourses

James 1st granted Pewsham Forest to the Earl of Anglesev. It was disforested in 1630, and broken, up for sale into small feefarms. At this point the peasantry lost their ancient rights and serious disturbances followed, during which а riotous assemblage, not being able to capture the Earl of Anglesey (whom they considered their prime enemy and oppressor), most ungallantly laid hands on his Countess, and carried off the noble lady prisoner. Audrey writes that the people made this rhyme " When Chipnam stood In Pewsham's wood Before it was destroyed, A cowe might have gone for a groate a year, And now it is denved."

Two granddaughters of the Earl of Anglesey inherited Pewsham. In 1791, they sold the larger part of it to Mr. Montague, of Lackham House (now Lackham College).

In 1832 William John Lysley (MP for Chippenham between 1859 and 1865) bought the Pewsham Estate – land that included Little, Middle and Great Lodge Farms and extended to the A4, where the Pewsham (Lysley Arms) public house stands.

William Lysley lived in Great Lodge Farm – just behind the Pewsham Garage – with his wife Caroline. They had four children; Caroline, Sarah, William Gerard and Warine. The East window of Christ Church, illustrating the Ascension of Our Lord, was erected in 1865 in memory of Caroline by William John Lysley.

William Gerard inherited the Pewsham Estate in 1873, passing it to Frances Lysley (his wife) on his death in 1887.

Frances Lysley built Pewsham House in 1892. Frances was the eldest child of Sir Charles Lowther of Swillington Hall in Leeds. Sir Charles was blind from birth and his mother was instrumental in promoting Braille in the UK. Frances was the widow of William Gerard Lysley - a lawyer and JP who died in 1887.

Charles Ponting was the architect for Pewsham House, responsible for Marlborough Town Hall and Dauntsey School. Ponting took inspiration from North Mimms - an Elizabethan House and the childhood home of William Gerard.

Frances moved her family into the new Pewsham House in 1892, living there until her death in 1918. The house passed to Major William Lysley and his wife Gwendoline. They were the heart of society in Derry Hill and Studley - noting numerous charity events for the aid of Christ Church.



The Major died in 1944. In 1945, Pewsham House was sold to George Young of Gordano, Bristol for £21,000. Gwendoline moved to live with her daughter Joan Lysley in Notton, Lacock and died in 1955.

Today, Pewsham House continues as a cornerstone of Derry Hill and the Lysley family who built it lie under the East window of Christ Church, Derry Hill.



#### FLOODLIGHTING THE SPIRE


