## **Editorial**

We head into a new month with (hopefully) the last of the cold and dark days of winter very much in the rear-view mirror and with the Spring Equinox and the move into British Summer Time later this month. There's promise of increased daylight hours and longer time spent outside. Our gardens and hedgerows are already showing signs of life with crocus and snowdrops already adding some colour and cheerful daffodils will shortly be bringing their brightness to an awakening world.

A nearby woodpecker has been busy since the end of January extending and re-boring the arboreal home prior to a busy season.

Our gardens will also be witnessing the acrobatic dusk flight of bats as they emerge from around one hundred and eighty-three days of hibernation and the odd hedgehog has already been seen during February, leaving their hibernation for a short time during warmer days. They too will shortly be carrying out their usual nightly patrols as food becomes more available.

In addition to the natural world re-awakening, March also sees an increase in the number of events which mark the passing year. The Saints Days of Wales and Ireland are marked this month with St. David's Day and St. Patrick's Day falling on 1 March and 17 March respectively. Lesser well known, 5 March sees St. Piran's day in Cornwall. The legend has it that in the sixth century Piran was thrown into the sea in Ireland and somehow managed to wash up ashore in Cornwall – even more impressive considering he had a millstone tied around his neck! His powers aided the locals in discovering and extracting tin from the

granite and many centuries later he became the patron saint of tin miners, becoming recognised as the Cornish saint, his black and white flag being freely flown across the county.

There is National Book Day on 2 March when children in schools up and down the country will attend dressed as their favourite book character with much emphasis given



that day to encourage reading for pleasure. The following day there is an interesting one in the USA – National Day of Unplugging. The idea is that for a twenty-four-hour period, people are encouraged to switch off all their digital devices and instead re-connect with the outside world, nature and even people. There is no doubt there are many who will struggle with this whole concept in this day and age! Only applies in the United States? The UK version takes place on 25 June......

In terms of sport, the annual university boat race will be held on 26 March, the first one having taken place back in 1827 and there is of course horse racing's Cheltenham Festival in mid-month plus many more events which somehow mark the start of the Spring season. On a note of history, the first F.A. Cup Final was staged at Kennington Oval on 16 March 1872 when Wanderers beat Royal Engineers. Enjoy the month!

#### **Dear Friends**,



This year Holy Week begins on 2<sup>nd</sup> April with Palm Sunday. As it is right at the beginning of April, I thought it would be useful to have something in the March Newsletter to briefly describe what Holv Week is about.

Once again, we are invited to enter into the

drama and passion of Jesus' journey to the Cross. It is easy in these busy times to find ourselves joining in with the 'Hosannas' of Palm Sunday and the 'Alleluias' of Easter Sunday a week later, without pausing to reflect more deeply on the stories and events of the days in between. Yet, experiencing something of the minor chords gives us a much richer celebration on Easter Day.

The retelling of the Passion on Palm Sunday sets the scene for what is to come. Then on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of Holy Week we hear stories of unrestrained love in Bethany; deep questions of life and death in a grain of wheat; betrayal.

Maundy Thursday takes us to the Last Supper and communion; to the washing of feet; to the stripping of the altar, to keeping watch.

Breaking bread and sharing wine; be transported to the upper room and recapture the mystery of the gift Jesus gives us of himself.

Foot washing is a profound expression of humility and what it means to love and serve one another. Many find this to be a particularly powerful experience; some feel uncomfortable or anxious. There is no compulsion to participate, it is completely voluntary; simply witnessing and acknowledging our responses is a valuable experience in itself.

Then to witness the removal of crosses, altar frontals, ornament...to keep vigil in the darkness (for a few minutes or an hour) helps us to find our place in this story.

We return on Good Friday to the church stripped bare, gazing on the Cross – from a distance, or up close and personal. We witness once more this desolate act. Jesus dies. Emptiness. We grieve.

This is a story we think we know so well. Yet participating in Holy Week gives us an opportunity to wrestle and ponder anew. I promise you there will be unexpected moments, profound moments of beauty and horror, moments of aching tension and waiting; all of which makes the Easter morning celebrations sublimely joyful.

May I encourage you to join us this Holy Week as the drama of God's purposes unfold? There will be services around the Marden Vale Team (keep an eye on the Notices). Come, let's journey together.

### The Night Sky in March

This month sees the return of British Summer Time at 01.00h on 26 March when clocks should move forward by an hour. This, along with the Spring Equinox, which is on 20 March, makes for lighter evenings and sky watching begins moving to more unsociable hours! However, there will still be



opportunities to view Venus and Jupiter in particular during the month.



Jupiter has been dominating the heavens for a few months but is now beginning to fade and will shortly disappear from view until later in the year whereas brilliant Venus will be easily identifiable as it will be the brightest object in the sky, setting at around 23.00h at month's end. The two planets will be very close together at 18.30h on 2 March, low in the western sky, shortly after sunset, Venus

being some five times brighter than the gas giant. Both will set at around 20.30h.

Further opportunities to see these two, this time alongside the Moon, will occur at the end of the month between 21-24 March at around 18.45 in the evening twilight low in the western sky. The Moon will be a thin crescent with Jupiter below, very low to the horizon. Venus will be bright and easily located adjacent to the Moon.

Mars is fading rapidly and more difficult to spot but a good opportunity to locate it will be on the evening of 27 March at 20.00h in the western sky when it will be slightly above and to the left of the Moon. The star immediately above the crescent Moon is Elnath. The following evening at the same time, the red planet will sit immediately below the Moon.

This month also provides the last opportunity to see the constellation of Orion in full until it reappears in the autumn. It is easily identifiable by the line-up of the three stars forming his belt and will he towards the western sky. The distance between thumb and little finger of an outstretched hand will roughly cover the whole constellation and red-tinged Betelgeuse will form his left shoulder. Following the three stars of the belt towards the



horizon will lead you to Sirius, the brightest star in our skies.

## The 4<sup>th</sup> Vicar of Derry Hill

The Reverend Henry Fletcher was the 4th vicar of Christ Church in Derry Hill. He served our community for 15 years from 1856 to 1871. Henry was born in Edinburgh in 1822, married Charlotte in 1851 and they had 5 children (3 born in Derry Hill).

In 1871, Rev Fletcher led the mass migration of 60 people from Derry Hill and Studley to Quebec, Canada. The paper of the day describes the scene at the Victoria Dock in London "a large party of emigrants on Friday embarked on board the steam



ship Medway bound for Quebec. A large group comprised chiefly of agriculturalists from Derry Hill, near Calne under the care of Rev. Mr Fetcher who will accompany them to Canada. Among the female emigrants were domestic servants who are in great demand in Canada. Nearly the whole of the party were in good spirits, and their physiques generally was in high order. Many of them complained of the want of money, in fact some were totally destitute of that essential commodity, but none appeared to want good health, the possession of which, when combined with energy and good conduct, will undoubtedly command success to the emigrant in his or her new home".



A few weeks later the local paper printed the message many in Derry Hill and Studley had been waiting for "the steamship Medway, which left London in the early part of last month for Quebec



, with a number of emigrants from Derry Hill under the care of Rev. Mr Fletcher, is reported by telegraph to have arrived safe at her destination".

A year later the local paper reported the fourth general meeting of the Derry Hill Free Library under the presidency of Lord Edmond Fitzgerald, the founder. In the meeting his lordship stated that the sum of £12 had been returned to him by the emigrants from Derry Hill to Canada and his lordship felt he could not do better than apply it to the purchase of new books for the library. This promise his lordship fulfilled.

The mass migration of 60 people from Derry Hill and Studley would have been a major event - one that touched so many families. You can see that connection with some of the names on our war memorial - men who were fighting under the Canadian flag, but very much remembered in Derry Hill and Studley.

The Rev Fletcher left Derry Hill in 1872 - moving his family up to Grasmere. He died and was buried in Oxford in 1914.

# Wiltshire Residents urged to report issues through Wiltshire Council's updated app.

Wiltshire Council has released an updated version of its smartphone app, MyWilts, and is reminding residents that it is the quickest and easiest way to report issues such as road defects, fly-tipping, trading standards issues and more.

The MyWilts app is available for <u>Apple</u> or <u>Android</u> devices and is also accessible through the Wiltshire Council website. This updated version



offers improvements such as upgraded mapping technology for street scene and enforcement reports, plus improved email communication, so that people can receive more updates about their report.

Current app users are advised to update their app through the Apple App Store or Google Play as soon as they can; while anyone who downloads the app for the first time will automatically receive the new and improved version. On Apple devices, the minimum iOS version required is 12.0; while on Android devices, people must be using version 7.0 or above.

Cllr Ashley O'Neill, Cabinet Member for Digital, said: "The MyWilts app is the quickest and easiest way for people to let us know about any issues they see while out and about in Wiltshire.

"People can use the app to let us know about issues such as road defects, fraud, fly-tipping and abandoned vehicles – and much more.

"This updated version also offers improved maps, so people can more accurately plot where any issues are, making it easier for our teams to find the reports. Also improved is the email communication, so when people let us know about an issue, they will receive more regular updates on the progress of their report.

#### Updating our Neighbourhood Plan: what's been happening?

#### Protecting our treasured 'Local Green Spaces'

We have been looking for opportunities to protect the green spaces which we all love, which give us room to breathe and get closer to nature, as well as somewhere to play or walk the dog.

The response to our survey was great and so many of you supported designating your local green spaces as part of the plan.

There are strict criteria for designation and we are currently hoping to include 28 in the revised plan. They range from small spaces with historic tree lines, such as the Calne Promenade near Holy Trinity Church and school, to the larger Castlefield Country Park, which includes the cycle path, the River Marden and open countryside close to the centre of town.

The support from landowners has generally been good, although there are some issues to resolve. We will keep you up to date as we progress this work.


In 2023 there will also be more opportunities for you to have your say on key topics such as housing, and on the overall draft Plan as work is progressed.



## Men have bigger hearts than women!

You can win it, You can break it! You can feel it, You can hear it beating! The heart is a vital organ in our body without which we cannot survive.

But how much do you really know about your heart?



1. The human body cannot survive without a heart, but the heart can survive without a human body! It sounds weird but it's true. The human heart has its own electrical impulses. This allows the heart to

continue beating even if it is separated from the body. However, there is one requirement. It should continue to get a steady supply of oxygen.

2. The human heart beats around 100,000 times in a single day. That's something like 3.6 billion beats in a lifetime.

3. What do we really mean when we say that our heart beats? Our heartbeat is the pumping action of the heart muscles. The heart is a pump that works day and night without rest. The moment the heart decides to take a rest, we are dead!

4. The human heart is responsible for pumping 2,000 gallons of blood each day. It is not that we have 2,000 gallons of blood in our body but the 10 pints of blood that we have is pumped so many times that the net volume pumped is 2,000 gallons and it sends it to different tissues and organs in our body through 60,000 miles of blood vessels!

**5.** When the heart is relaxed, the pressure exerted by the blood on the chambers of the heart is called the diastolic blood pressure and when the heart is beating/pumping, the pressure exerted by the blood is known as the systolic pressure. A single heartbeat can squirt blood up to 30 feet away!

**6**. The heart is roughly the size of a large fist and weighs between 10 to 12 ounces in men and 8 to 10 ounces in women - so there you have it:

#### Men really do have bigger hearts than women!

#### Crime and incident updates

On 28/01/2022 22:20hrs, a white Ford Fiesta collided with a telephone post in Fishers Brook, Calne. Thankfully the driver only sustained very minor injuries. The investigation is ongoing regarding the driver's standard of driving prior to the collision.

On 05/02/2023 22:18hrs, a brown Vauxhall Astra was stopped on the A4 in Quemerford, Calne. The driver failed to provide a breath sample, so was arrested on suspicion of failing to provide a sample of breath at the roadside. The driver was then conveyed to custody. When in custody, the driver did provide a sample and was found to be over the alcohol limit. He was then subsequently arrested for that offence.

07/02/2023 18:45hrs, a pedestrian sadly died after being struck by a vehicle near to the Studley Crossroads on the A4 Derry Hill. We are not able to comment on this matter at this time as there is currently an ongoing police investigation. Our thoughts and prayers are with the family and friends of the male involved.

08/02/2023 02:00hrs, Officers sighted a black Volkswagen Touran stopping near another vehicle in Sandy Lane. Officers observed that items were being exchange seen between parties. On the vehicle being stopped by Officers drugs were thrown from the car. A passenger of the

vehicle was arrested on suspicion of possession of a controlled class A substance with the intent to supply and conveyed to Melksham Custody.

Speeding

We have recently received reports of vehicles travelling at excessive speeds through the 20mph limit in the village of Derry Hill.

On 23<sup>rd</sup> January, due to the concerns raised, we conducted speed checks in Church Road.

Two drivers were given words of advice for being found to be slightly over the 20mph limit, both drivers were residents of the village.

As the Calne Neighbourhood Team we are fully committed to keeping our roads as safe as possible and we will continue to conduct speed checks in this and other surrounding locations.

Livestock worrying

Lambing season is upon us, and we are asking dog owners to act responsibly and put all dogs on a lead when around any livestock.

Livestock-worrying is a criminal offence, and the penalty can be six months imprisonment and/or a fine of up to £1000.



Why is this important?

You are responsible for your dog; action may be taken against you and your dog. Dogs should not be left unaccompanied outside of the home, and their behaviour should be managed at all times if livestock are present

How can you prevent this?

Enjoy the countryside but keep your dog on a lead when walking your dogs on a public footpath, near or through a farmer's field.

Know the area where you walk your dog and keep an eye out for any fences, gates, and signs.

If you come across a dog actively attacking livestock, contact police on 999 and give us a specific location (https://crowd.in/qOyPXF) if possible, along with description of the dog, owner, and any vehicle belonging to the dog owners.

PCSO Mark Cook says: "Any dog has the ability to worry livestock – it can be any type of dog, no matter how well trained. Once worrying starts, recall usually goes out the window".

"Prevention by using a lead is always the best course of action. Sheep are frequently killed by dogs. Chasing can cause extreme stress, miscarriage, mismothering of lambs, and horrific injuries resulting in euthanasia. It can be traumatic for farmers who have to deal with the aftermath of an incident".

"Farmers are the ones who put their heart and soul into the soil to give it life and give us food. Let us thank them for their efforts and salute their hard work. Please share this post and help spread the word".

#### Fly-tipping

In November Wiltshire Council launched a new campaign to combat fly-tipping in the county.

The striking campaign, which builds on the success of the council's hard-hitting We're Targeting Fly-tippers (WTF) branding, focuses on three key areas:



- Warning people of the penalties of fly-tipping including unlimited fines, prosecution and seized vehicles.
- Encouraging residents to report fly-tipping.
- Educating and informing people about how they can safely and legally dispose of their waste, particularly highlighting the dangers of using 'tip run' style social media advertisements.

The campaign is part of the council's investment of an extra £150,000 each year for the next three years into tackling fly-tipping and environmental crime in the county. The bulk of this funding is being spent on more officers and equipment such as state-of-the-art cameras to catch these environmental criminals in the act.

## **News from Wiltshire Council**

#### Save money on your parking with a season ticket

Do you regularly use our car parks?

If so, a <u>parking season ticket</u> is a more convenient way for you to commute and save money.

Having a season ticket can help you save approximately 50% on the daily rate in our car parks.

Season tickets are available at individual car parks across the county, including those in Chippenham, Devizes, Melksham, Trowbridge and Salisbury, and are available in one-month, three-month, six-month or 12month options.



#### Recycling - let's sort it!

Let's be honest, sometimes it can be really tricky to know which bins to put certain items in!

Our <u>Recycling-let's sort it! campaign</u> is now underway as we aim to make it easier for you to understand which items go into the correct bins. Some of the common items incorrectly placed in blue lidded bins include:

Carrier bags and bin bags - put these in the general waste bin for energy recovery.

Hard plastics, such as toys and plant pots - take these to a household recycling centre for recycling; or put in the general waste bin for energy recovery.

Scrap metals - take these to a household recycling centre for recycling. Nappies - put these in the general waste bin for energy recovery.

Waste crews have stepped up their visual checks of recycling bins and between Monday 20 February and Friday 3 March will advise you if your bin contains the wrong items by placing an amber bin tag on the handle of your bin.

### Speed

Sadly, we're probably all be aware of the recent tragic accident on A4 and I'm sure we all have huge sympathy for the family and friends of the person killed on the A4.

Although the cause of the accident may not yet be determined, the tragic accident has rightly brought an outpouring of reactions from many of us who want to see improved safety on the roads in and around our villages.

We all know that the A4 near Studley Crossroads is potentially a very dangerous road, primarily because of the high speed of traffic which can turn relatively minor errors of judgement into serious and fatal collisions. Over the years additional local housing developments have added to queuing at the crossroads increasing driver frustration leading to the risk of more errors of judgement.

A roundabout or signals at the crossroads would certainly cost many hundreds of thousands of pounds and would possibly require the demolition of property which, Wiltshire Council as the highway authority, have soundly rejected calls for in the past. Even if they could afford a major improvement, we should remember that around half the traffic on Church Road is using it as a 'Rat Run' to avoid congestion in Calne. A roundabout or signals may or may not be safer, but they would make it a much easier 'Rat Run', attracting more drivers from the congested routes in Calne. - How do we feel about double the through traffic on Church Road?

The Parish Council commissioned a transport consultant, Entrans to undertake a feasibility study into road safety in our area. Included in their recommendations on a dozen or so other safety concerns, was the need a review of speed limits on the A4 between Calne and the Pewsham roundabout. The Parish Council has pressed for, and part funded, a review by Wiltshire Council of the speed limits on the A4. Wiltshire Council's consultants recently completed the review and recommended that the whole of the 60mph speed limit each side of the 50 mph section at Studley Crossroads should be reduced to 50mph. Bizarrely and very disappointingly they felt the 50 mph at Studley Crossroads was OK. The Parish Council in line with its own consultant, strongly disagrees and have been seeking a 40mph speed limit on the crossroads section of the A4 whilst supporting 50 mph on the hills in each direction.

The Parish Council is well on the way to getting at least some of the speed limits reduced but that's only the beginning - speed limits have to be adhered to and enforced. I wager there's not one driver in our villages who can honestly say they have never, ever exceeded a speed limit. The parish council's Speed Indicator Devices show speeding is commonplace yet Wiltshire Police have one of, if not, the worst record in England in enforcing speeding.

What struck me in the days after the accident was that most of the local people commenting on social media and elsewhere, were perhaps understandably not aware of what the Parish Council has already been doing to improve road safety over the last year or so. That's understandable as reports on Parish Council meetings are rarely riveting reading but. to help, links to some details of recommendations from the Parish Council's transport consultants Road Safety Feasibility Report which sets out proposals to address many of local people's concerns can be found on the <u>Derry Hill and Studley Hub website</u>.

The Parish Council's feasibility study proposes a 20mph speed limit throughout Studley with measures to keep speeds down in both Derry Hill & Studley. Weight restrictions are also recommended to protect Studley and parts of Bremhill from large HGVs trying to take short cuts through our narrow lanes. Whilst these are really important improvements, I think most people would agree that the speed of traffic on the A4 between Calne and the Pewsham roundabout is of the greatest concern.

Whilst the prospects of getting the 60mph limits reduced to 50mph are very good, the Parish Council will face major resistance from Wiltshire's Highway Department towards lowering the 50mph limit around Studley Crossroads to 40mph. The Council will need your support as local residents in order to win the argument for reducing the limit.

It's hoped to launch the consultation on all the major proposals at the Annual Parish Meeting on 27th April. In the meantime, please let the Parish Council know (preferably in writing/email) your thoughts and experiences of using the A4, not just as a car user but particularly as a pedestrian or cyclist. The Parish Council and our Wiltshire Councillor, Ashley O'Neil can then use those experiences to help convince Wiltshire Council of the need to reduce traffic speeds that have been a blight on our villages for too long.



#### Wellbeing notes Outdoor spring clean



If you see a piece of litter on a country walk, do you pick it up sometimes, often, or never? In my case, if I'm honest, it depends on the litter. Some items can't easily be picked up. Other times, I'm rushing past on my way to a Very Pressing Appointment, and I'd rather not turn up all mucky. But I hope that I do try to bag litter at least some of the time.

When you or I pick up discarded rubbish, we're contributing to a beneficial

practice which has been gaining real traction in the UK.

This year the Great British Spring Clean runs from 17<sup>th</sup> March to 2<sup>nd</sup> April. Look out for individuals, pledging to fill a single bag; and volunteer groups, working together. For ideas on how to join in, see <u>Keep Britain</u> <u>Tidy</u>. In 2022's Spring Clean, nearly half a million bags of refuse were apparently collected and properly disposed of. That's a lot of tidying up – enough to make a visible difference.

Walking outdoors is brilliant for mental wellbeing as well as physical health. One of my favourite local walks takes me through woods, meadowland and over a tiny wild garlic stream, all dappled in sunlight. Over the coming weeks, additional flowers will grow along the route: fragrant bluebells like the ones pictured here; dainty lady's smock; vibrant orchids; purple knapweed and tall, waving daisies. What I'd rather not see among them is an empty can or plastic wrapper, so if there's anything along those lines, here is my pledge that I'll be picking it up.


