

## THE TERM IS OVER: THE HOLIDAYS HAVE BEGUN

You're probably wondering if you read that heading correctly! But as I write it, it's true: it's the end of July, school term finished last week, and most of you are enjoying your holidays.

But you won't be reading this until September. If term time hasn't begun yet, it will do very soon. You may well have that sinking feeling which comes when it's time to go back to work, or college, or school. So why am I writing about the holidays?

Well, for a start, I hope you've enjoyed your holiday, and that you've thanked God for it! Secondly, I want to ask you to reflect for a moment on the best holiday you've ever had. How did it match your expectations of it? How did it exceed them?

The following paragraph comes from C S Lewis' <u>The Last Battle</u>. Aslan, the lion, says to the children:

"The term is over: the holidays have begun. The dream is ended: this is the morning" . . . And for us this is the end of all the stories, and we can most truly say that they all lived happily ever after. But for them it was only the beginning of the real story. All their life in this world and all their adventures in Narnia had only been the cover and the title page: now at last they were beginning Chapter One of the Great Story which no one on earth has read: which goes on forever: in which every chapter is better than the one before.

(From The Last Battle, Lions edition, 1980, pp 171-172)

You may already know that the children to whom Aslan is speaking have died and gone to heaven. C S Lewis had a great point: heaven will be a thousand times better than the best holiday we've ever enjoyed.

Bits of the Bible are like a travel brochure: they give us glimpses of what heaven will be like. But whereas travel brochures can make the dingiest hotel and the grottiest beach sound like Paradise, the Bible tells us the truth. We can completely trust what it says. Why don't you get your Bible out (or use the internet!) and read through Revelation 21:1-4 & 22-27?

I hope that such a vision encourages you, and makes you want to echo the song of the angels from earlier in the book of Revelation:

"Amen! Praise and glory and wisdom and thanks and honour and power and strength be to our God for ever and ever. Amen!" (Revelation 7:12)

#### Cardiac Arrest - 999 & CPR ASAP

If you see a person in cardiac arrest, call 999 immediately and start CPR. You will be told what to do by the 999 operator while you wait for an ambulance to arrive.



Time is critical and CPR is necessary to maintain an oxygen supply to the brain and other organs until the heart can be restarted by defibrillation shock.

You don't need to be qualified to do CPR or to use a defib, you are trying to save a life!



#### The Sky at night

September is here, the nights are drawing in, and it's a brilliant time

to get outside and look up. This year, though, the sky has something extra special in store—a rare **Blood Moon eclipse**—alongside the usual mix of shifting constellations and bright planets.



Here's what to watch out for over the month.

The headline act comes early. On the evening of **Sunday 7 September**, the Moon will rise over the UK already in the middle of a **total lunar eclipse**. For about 80 minutes, the Moon will glow a deep rusty red—what's often called a "**Blood Moon**".

Now, there's a catch: from Britain, the Moon will be **very low on the eastern horizon** during the eclipse, so you'll need a clear, open view to the east to catch it. If you can find a hilltop or a stretch of coastline, you'll be in with the best chance. Even so, it promises to be one of the most dramatic lunar events of the decade.

The gas giants are slowly stealing the spotlight this month. **Saturn** lingers in the southern sky, a steady golden glow in the constellation Aquarius. If you've got binoculars—or better yet, a small telescope—you'll even be able to spot its famous rings.

Later in the evening, **Jupiter** makes an appearance, getting brighter as the weeks pass ahead of its big opposition in November. **Mars** and **Venus**, meanwhile, are keeping out of the way, staying close to the Sun and tricky to catch.

Finally, on **22 September**, the **autumn equinox** arrives. Day and night are equal in length, and from then on, the evenings really start to stretch out—perfect for longer stargazing sessions.

## Gifts galore at fundraising sale for Wiltshire Bobby Van

The popular Devizes Autumn Fair, which has been running for more than 20 years, will once again be featuring unique gifts, clothes and crafts to raise funds for the Wiltshire Bobby Van The Trust at Corn Exchange in **Devizes** from 10am to 4.30pm on October 3rd.



The fair will feature dozens of stalls from craftsmen and women and producers from across the South West. There will also be refreshments available at the event's pop-up café. Tickets are £5 per person but anyone booking online in advance can get two for the price of one. Tickets are available at devizes autumnfair.co.uk.

The charity operates two vans, both staffed by former police officers, which visit homes across Wiltshire and Swindon to offer free practical home security measures, fire safety assessments and online safety guidance for people over 60 or over 18 with a registered disability

It works in partnership with Wiltshire Police and other organisations including Victim Support, Age UK, housing associations and Wiltshire Council's trading standards department to identify people who need help and reassurance.

Director Jennie Shaw said: "This will be a wonderful chance to get started on the Christmas shopping, with so many stalls featuring some unique hand-crafted gifts from local producers — and help us to continue keeping older and vulnerable people safe in their homes." At our July meeting, the Parish Council considered a request to take over responsibility for the production and publishing of inSPIRE magazine. This is such an important magazine for our community that we felt it was



vital to keep it going. We will do our best to build on the hard work that Richard Aylen has put into it. I am pleased that so many of the volunteers involved in its production and distribution are happy to carry on and I'd like to thank them for their continuing support.

Another of our responsibilities is being the custodian of the Well House on Old Derry Hill. This was built at the end of the 19<sup>th</sup> Century by the Poynder family of Hartham Park, near Corsham. They built three identical ones at Colerne, Biddestone and Hilmarton. The Parish Council formally adopted ours in 2002 and restored it at the time, with support from North Wilts District Council and Viridor.

Following deterioration and storm damage last winter, I am pleased that we have completed repairs to the roof and replaced the broken finial. We appreciate the support and advice from the Wiltshire Historic Buildings Trust and I would also like to thank Bath Roofing on a great job.




#### **Book Club Review**

#### The Women by Kristin Hannah

The Women is a gripping fiction that explores the experiences of Frances "Frankie" McGrath, a young nurse who volunteers to serve in the Vietnam War. The book follows Frankie's personal journey from a sheltered upbringing to the harsh realities of war and the struggles she faces upon returning home.

Hannah masterfully explores themes of identity, courage, and resilience. Frankie's initial naivety is gradually stripped away as she faces the visceral horrors of combat hospitals, the chaos of trying to save lives with limited resources, and the emotional toll of loss that accumulates day after day.

Frankie's struggle to find recognition



and purpose amid trauma is deeply compelling, made all the more powerful by the bonds she forms with her fellow nurses, Ethel and Barb. These friendships, rooted in mutual understanding, shared sacrifice, and moments of both tenderness and laughter, are beautifully portrayed. They're not just connections formed in adversity; they are anchors in a chaotic world. Through those relationships, we see Frankie redefine herself, not just as a nurse or a woman, but as someone who has endured and survived something indescribable. There's a raw honesty in Hannah's writing that doesn't flinch from grief, guilt, or the longing for belonging.

Elizabeth Clark home manager at Kingston House said: "Our residents have experienced so much throughout their lives and asking them to share their nurturing tips- their seeds of wisdom- was

incredibly inspiring and thought-provoking. It was also another opportunity for a therapeutic activity together."








The Thursday Club, which meets in Chippenham Library, was set to discuss 'Favourite forms of exercise, then and


