





### **Rector's notes**

For the pragmatic reason that my mother-in-law gave us a packet of sunflowers seeds that had come free with a magazine, this year my wife Alice and I have had the simple pleasure of watching quite a good number of sunflowers grow in various spots around our garden.

What was striking was how they flowered entirely independently of each other. One or two flowered in mid/late July. Others showed the faintest hint of a flower, and then stayed like that for weeks, till their time was ready. At the time of writing (mid-September) we still have just one left, its head now beginning to droop. Also, from somewhere in my consciousness I thought all the sunflowers would face the sun, whereas ours were a maverick bunch and seemed to face a variety of directions.

It struck me as an mildly interesting analogy with how we ourselves all operate at our own level / timing. Some of us are keen to rush on. Others prefer a more measured approach. Some people might be perceived as more handsome specimens than others, or are larger or smaller. Some flower together with others, and some are individualistic to the point they just want to do their own thing!

Of course for human beings to do well we have rather more factors to take into account than sunflowers. As far as we know sunflowers are not in competition about which flowers first – the processes just unfold according to circumstances. Whereas for we humans, some have all sorts of advantages in life given to them, while others may have to battle against all sorts of difficulties just to survive.

The idea of human flourishing is one which I think practically every person knows within themselves is of fundamental importance. But it raises challenging questions: how much am I concerned that not just my family and I but *every* person (and indeed every part of creation) has the possibility of flourishing? Is it possible that in attending to my own flourishing, I negatively affect someone else's? How should we apply this challenge to the issue of those seeking asylum in our safe country, whilst also taking into account this country's limited resources?

Christian teaching of course includes the call to love our neighbour as ourselves, to 'love the foreigner residing with you', and even to love our enemies (however we might define them). That might not make those big political decisions any easier, but starting from the point of

loving and valuing all people regardless of how *like us* they are sounds like the sort of approach Jesus would take. In the letter to the Colossians we read this: 'clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience...Forgive as the Lord forgave you. And over all these virtues put on love'

Once again, this year we are holding a Remembering Service at Christ



Church Derry Hill to remember those people close to us whom we have lost. If a loved one of yours has died recently or in years and gone by, whether they were local or lived far awav. vou are welcome to come to this service to remember them

before God. If you'd like their name to be read out, please email it to the benefice office, or simply add their name to the list in church.

### **How Does a Defibrillator Work?**

As the name suggests, defibrillation stops **fibrillation**, the useless trembling that a person's heart muscles can adopt during a cardiac arrest. Simply speaking, a



defibrillator works by using a moderately high voltage (something like 200–1000 volts) to pass an electric current through the heart so it's shocked into working normally again – at least that's the objective!

The kind of defibrillator you see on TV consists of an electric supply unit and two metal electrodes called paddles that are pressed very firmly to the patient's chest using insulating plastic handles (so the person using them doesn't get a shock too). In a hospital the doctor manually sets the voltage and usually increases it if the first attempt fails. The important thing is getting the current to flow through the heart, so where the paddles are applied is crucial and a conducting gel is usually applied to the patient's chest first. Does the patient leap up in the air like on television? No, that's just TV being overly dramatic!

Our automatic defibrillators in the village are designed to be used by untrained people and issue precise audible instructions telling the user exactly what to do and where to place the pads. They use sticky, self-adhesive electrode pads instead of paddles for safety and simplicity: once the pads are stuck on, the operator can stand well clear of the patient's body and that reduces the risk of their getting an electric shock. Our automatic units test the heart first before applying an appropriate electric shock if needed. If the patient's heart is working correctly our automatic units do not give an electric shock, so they are completely safe!

### The Night Sky in October 2025:

October is a month when the nights get longer, the air feels fresher, and the stars really seem to sparkle. And this year, the sky is serving up plenty of reasons to head outside.



First up, the Full Moon arrives in the early

hours of 7 October, known traditionally as the Hunter's Moon. Rising just after sunset on the 6th and glowing through the night, this Moon tends to look extra-large and bright, hanging low on the horizon.

If you love meteor showers, October gives you not one but two! The Draconids are first, peaking around 8 October. They're unusual because they're best spotted in the early evening. Worth a look if the skies are clear just after sunset.

The Orionids are the headline. Active all month, they peak on the night of 21–22 October, with swift, bright meteors streaking out of Orion's "club.". Head out after midnight, wrap up warm, and you could catch 20 meteors an hour under good conditions.

October also offers a few opportunities to spot the brighter planets: Saturn hangs in the southern sky after sunset. With a small telescope you'll be able to glimpse the famous rings.

Jupiter rises in the pre-dawn hours, brightening as the month goes on Venus is the true "morning star" this month, dazzling in the east before sunrise. If you're up early, you can't miss it.


Mercury puts in a brief appearance low in the southwest just after sunset in the latter half of the month (around the 18th–28th). You'll need a clear, low horizon to catch it.

I am pleased to welcome Lord Kerry who was formally co-opted onto the Parish Council at our September meeting, as the councillor for Bowood and Sandy Lane Ward. We do still have one outstanding vacancy for

You may remember that back in 2023 we presented the results of our Road Safety Feasibility Study to a packed Parish Meeting. Many of the recommendations have now been implemented, but two significant schemes for traffic calming measures in Derry Hill and Studley are still in progress.

This year, we were successful in bidding for substantive highways scheme funding from Wiltshire Council for the traffic calming measures in Derry Hill, one of just eight schemes selected across the county. This is in the pipeline for delivery next Spring.

At our September meeting, we approved our contribution towards a similar bid for substantive scheme funding for the measures in Studley, to reinforce the recently implemented 20mph speed limit. We also approved our contribution towards the cost of white gates for Old Derry Hill and Pewsham to help moderate driver behaviour along our main roads.

### Calne Neighbourhood Policing Update

Crime and incident updates

On 16/08/2025 at 16:01hrs, a white Seat was sighted being driven in Studley. The driver of the vehicle was found to not have a license or insurance. The vehicle was seized, and the driver was reported for the offences.



On 23/08/2025 at 13:07hrs, police attended a two-vehicle road traffic collision on the A3102. One driver was arrested for driving under the influence of alcohol but was de-arrested due to having to attend hospital for treatment. The offence of drink driving will be progressed using slower time enquiries.

On 27/08/2025 at 18:43hrs, a vehicle was stopped by police on the A3102 due to the manner driving. The driver was tested then arrested for driving under the influence of alcohol and taken to custody.

On 01/09/2025 at 20:32hrs, police attended a report of a vehicle colliding with a deer on the A4 Derry Hill. The driver was uninjured, but driver's vehicle sustained some damage.

### Driving in adverse weather conditions

We are responding to higher numbers of vehicle collisions during this time of year.

We urge drivers to take extra care on the roads around Wiltshire, with ice, snow and flooding in some areas leading to hazardous conditions.



Please avoid unnecessary journeys and if you must drive, reduce your speed - it can take 10 times longer to stop in icy/wet conditions, and do not attempt to drive through deep flooded routes.

Always ensure all windows, any snow-covered surfaces are clear before moving off.

The Highway Code provides more information about driving in adverse weather conditions.

Cyclists, especially children please ensure that you/they have sufficient reflective clothing and appropriate lighting when riding your bike at this time of year.

We are receiving several reports of cyclists wearing dark clothing and not being visible in our area.

This also includes children travelling to and from school. Our evenings are slowly getting darker, but please be mindful of this as we move through the darker mornings.

### Protect your oil tank.

As we move into the winter months we are advising of security of oil tanks on our area, prevention being key.

Whilst it may seem like an unlikely target for criminals, the theft of heating oil is not uncommon - particularly in rural areas at this time of the year.

Domestic oil tanks can contain many hundreds of pounds worth of oil. As the price of fuel remains high it makes it a valuable target for thieves.

There are however several things you can do to help protect your oil supply.

Wherever possible, keep fuel tanks locked and alarmed and install them within secure buildings or a cage. Consider installing anti-siphon devices, remote oil level gauges which set off an audible alarm if the level drops suddenly. You can also consider installing motion sensing lighting and CCTV connected to your mobile device when away from your property.

If it's not possible to keep your tank inside a building, please consider planting spikey shrubs which serve as a good deterrent. You can also use fencing and hedging to hide your tank.

Organised by the council's Dog Warden team, the competition invited children aged 5 to 14 to design bold, eye-catching posters reminding dog owners to clean up after their pets.

Over 60 vibrant entries were submitted and judged by representatives from Bath Cats and Dogs Home. The top three finalists in each age category (4-6, 7-9, and 10-14 years) were shortlisted and showcased on Wiltshire Council's Facebook page, where the public cast more than 1,000 votes to select the winners.

The winning artists, George (6), Elise (8), and Freya (10), were celebrated at the event and presented with keepsake versions of their designs by Cabinet Member Cllr Paul Sample JP and Paul Ashman from the council's Streetscene contractor, *i*dverde. Their artwork will now be displayed across a variety of parks, footpaths and open spaces to help spread the message in a fun and engaging way.

Congratulations to our winners, George, Elise, and Freya, their work will make a real difference.
