



Derry Hill and Studley Parish Council

On 10th October, I attended the Calne Area Local Highways and Footway Improvement Group (also known by the clunky acronym of "LHFIG"). This committee brings together Wiltshire Council with the town and parish



councils in the wider Calne area to consider highways issues. LHFIG has a devolved budget (just £24,930 this year) to fund modest local improvements.

Happily, our parish had a successful morning, with backing for both schemes that I talked about last month. Firstly, our scheme for village gates for Pewsham and Old Derry Hill was approved, with a Wiltshire Council commitment of £4,975. Secondly, our scheme for traffic calming measures in Studley and Norley Lane was also supported as a bid for this year's round of substantive scheme funding, with a £5,000 contribution from LHFIG.

At our Parish Council meeting in October, we also voted to replace the two dog bins on Petty Acre. These are the responsibility of Wiltshire Council, but we have their agreement to replace them without taking over the responsibility (and cost) of future emptying.

The agendas, papers and minutes of Parish Council meetings are always published on our website. Meetings are open to members of the public, who are welcome to attend to see local democracy in action.

Vicar's notes

REMEMBER, REMEMBER . . .

You've probably already completed the famous rhyme about the Gunpowder Plot in your head . . . gunpowder, treason and plot; I know of no reason why the Gunpowder Treason should ever be forgot.

During the first couple of weeks of November, we do a lot of remembering. All Souls' Day falls on 2 November. It's a day on which Christians traditionally remember and give thanks to God for all faithful Christians who have died. Churches often hold a special service



around this time, which in our churches here is called a 'Remembering Service'. We invite all those who would like to remember before God those whom they love but see no longer, to come and do that together in church. If you'd like to take part in such a service, you should find details for your local church(es) elsewhere in the publication in which you're reading this article!

A few days later, we remember the Gunpowder Plot and give thanks that it wasn't successful. Traditionally, we do that by lighting bonfires and letting off fireworks. The longer version of the rhyme quoted above includes the line: By God's providence he [ie Guy Fawkes] was catch'd. Then, of course on 11 November and the Sunday closest to it, many Acts of Remembrance will take place, as we remember and give thanks for those who gave their lives in the First World War, and many other wars since; men and women who lost their lives in the cause of defending their nation, and enabling their descendants (us) to live in freedom and peace.

If you attend Church services regularly, then you'll be aware that we remember and give thanks for the death of our Lord Jesus Christ, at every service of Holy Communion. We remember and give thanks because it's in Jesus' life, death, resurrection and ascension that we can find hope in a world which often feels confusing and hopeless.



Cardiac Arrest - 999 & CPR ASAP

If you see a person in cardiac arrest, call 999 immediately and start CPR. You will be told what to do by the 999 operator while you wait for an ambulance to arrive. Time is critical and CPR is necessary to maintain an oxygen supply to the brain



and other organs until the heart can be restarted by defibrillation shock.

You don't need to be qualified to do CPR or to use a defib, you are trying to save a life!

The Night Sky in November 2025:

As the nights grow long and crisp, November offers rich stargazing opportunities across the UK — from shooting stars to bright planets and the return of winter constellations.

Meteor showers are the main highlight. The Taurids peak around 12 November, producing slow, bright meteors and occasional fireballs. A few nights later, the famous Leonids reach their peak on 17 November. Although moonlight from a nearby full Moon may wash out fainter meteors, patient observers could still catch some impressive streaks in the pre-dawn hours.

November's full Moon on the 15th is also a supermoon, appearing slightly larger and brighter than usual as it passes near its closest point to Earth. Its glare will dominate the sky for a few nights but offers a striking sight for photographers.

In the evening sky, Jupiter and Saturn shine brightly in the south, joined at times by the crescent Moon in mid-month. Mars sits lower toward the horizon, gradually fading, while Venus glimmers before dawn late in the month.


For deep-sky watchers, the Pleiades star cluster sparkles in Taurus, easily visible to the naked eye and stunning through binoculars. Nearby, the grand shape of Orion rises later each evening, marking the coming of winter's most recognisable constellations.

Whether you're spotting meteors, planets, or the glittering Seven Sisters, November's long nights reward anyone who takes a moment to look up.

Book Club Review The Glass Maker by Tracy Chevalier

This sweeping historical novel follows a family of glass makers on the island of Murano near Venice. The novel spans 6 centuries and uses a very unconventional method of having the characters age at a different rate to real time. Thus, the central character, Orsola, starts as a small child in 1486 and only becomes elderly in 2019. Some people have found this confusing but I thought it worked well and avoided having too many different characters to get to grips with.



The descriptions of Venice and the lagoon are wonderful, making you feel you are wandering through the squares or travelling the canals in a gondola. Orsola, her 2 brothers and the extended family are well drawn characters that you learn to love or dislike. The author's research is extensive, covering the plague, the rise and fall of the economy of Venice and the techniques of glassmaking in Murano.

However, I think that the great strength of the book is in its depiction of the power of women. Orsola's family is torn apart by the death of her father, a master glass maker. Neither of her brothers have the same skill or character to make the intricate pieces and Orsola learns to make glass beads and sell them to help the family survive at a time when women were only supposed to do housework.

The depictions of suffering during the plague are very powerful - when whole families were nailed up in their houses to stop it spreading. The smallness of their world comes across well too, they were frightened of going across to Venice, a 20-minute boat trip and even more scared of "terrafirma", the mainland.

I think Tracy Chevalier has given us a great novel, very readable and meticulously researched and it was well received in book club and is highly recommended.

Calne Neighbourhood Policing Update

Crime and incident updates

 On 08/09/2025, an unknown female driving a car has driven around a bend startling a horse by driving aggressively towards it and the rider in Tytherton Lucas. No further police action taken due to a lack of evidence.



- On 08/09/2025 at 13:44hrs, unknown persons have sprayed graffiti on the boundary boarding of a construction site on Oxford Road in Calne.
- On 19/09/2025, an unknown person has damaged a fuel line to an oil tank which supplies a household in Bremhill.
- On 25/09/2025, a vehicle was located on Church Road, Derry Hill with damage to a wheel. The driver was also located asleep on the rear seat of the vehicle under the influence of alcohol. The female driver was arrested on suspicion of being found in charge of a vehicle whilst being under the influence of alcohol. The driver was conveyed to custody and later charged with the offence.
- On 27/09/2025, unknown persons have taken items from a clothing recycle bin in Beversbrook Road, Calne.
- On 05/10/2025, an unknown person has thrown an item at a moving vehicle windscreen causing damage in Mile Elm.
- On 09/10/2025, a vehicle was stopped by officers on the A4 near Derry Hill. The driver of the vehicle admitted she had been recently smoking cannabis. The female driver was arrested on suspicion of driving a vehicle whilst being under the influence of drugs and being found in possession of a Class B drug. The driver was conveyed to custody and later released under police investigation.

Protect your oil tank.

Whilst it may seem like an unlikely target for criminals, the theft of heating oil is not uncommon - particularly in rural areas at this time of the year.

Domestic oil tanks can contain many hundreds of pounds worth of oil. As the price of fuel remains high it makes it a valuable target for thieves.



There are however several things you can do to help protect your oil supply.

Wherever possible, keep fuel tanks locked and alarmed and install them within secure buildings or a cage. Consider installing anti-siphon devices, remote oil level gauges which set off an audible alarm if the level drops suddenly. You can also consider installing motion sensing lighting and CCTV connected to your mobile device when away from your property.


If it's not possible to keep your tank inside a building, please consider planting spikey shrubs which serve as a good deterrent. You can also use fencing and hedging to hide your tank.

The most evocative sound in the world

The path along Cocklemore Brook gets a bit muddy at times. Pretty, but muddy. The other day I was tiptoeing over damp autumn leaves when a noise overhead caused me to look up. Geese, honking in formation – flapping heavy wings in a tired 'V' shape they likely maintained all the way from Iceland, Greenland or beyond.

There's something rather soulful about the noise of flying geese. How do they manage to sound both mournful. and adventurous? Perhaps I'm dwelling on this right now because my daughter has recently gone to the other side of the world, and she won't be back until the geese have returned to their homelands, hatched their young, and started gathering for their next winter in the British Isles.



There is a wrench somewhere around the heart when a loved one is absent. Yet it's not all sad, because I'm happy for my daughter to stretch her own wings: to enjoy a new adventure and become more independent.

The urge to travel is no doubt deep within humans, as much as it's within those tired geese overhead. If we can't, or choose not to, cover physical distance, we can always use our imaginations. Perhaps that's why the honking of geese as they fly is so evocative: it's the sound of faraway places, heard within the comfort of our own neighbourhood.
