

Derry Hill and Studley Parish Council

At our November meeting, the Parish Council voted to procure some "Twenty is Plenty" adhesive stickers for wheelie bins. These will help reinforce the 20mph speed limits which cover much of Derry Hill and Studley.





Before ordering them, we would like to gauge the level of community interest: if you would like stickers for your wheelie bins, then please email us at clerk@derryhillandstudley-pc.gov.uk to register your interest.

We have also been working on our budget for the next financial year. The Council's running costs are funded

through the "precept" – basically a surcharge on the Council Tax. The precept each property pays is determined by dividing the Council's funding request by the tax base of the parish. Last year this worked out at £52.95 for a Band D Property.

This year, we have looked closely at the budget, prioritised funds in new areas and have made savings, resulting in a small reduction to our funding request. However, Wiltshire Council has advised us that they made an error in our tax base last year: this year, the corrected tax base is likely to be 7% lower. Subject to final approval of our Budget for 2026/27 at our December meeting, we estimate that the property precept will need to increase by 3-9p/week depending on the

Finally, we still have one remaining vacancy on the Council. If you are interested in joining the Council to serve your community, then please drop our Parish Clerk an email (details below).

Rector's notes for December 2025

One of the aspects of clergy ministry which isn't necessarily pointed out to candidates applying for selection is that it's helpful if a clergy person can sing, especially in traditional sorts of churches like the ones in our benefice. Notably at smaller funerals, where the family is nonetheless keen to include a couple of hymns, the vicar does sometimes end up nearly singing a solo.

Happily for me I really enjoy singing. Every Monday evening I join in the bass section of Calne Choral Society, which incidentally has people in it from across the benefice, though we rehearse in Calne. We do three or four concerts a year, always in St Mary's Church, and the audience is mainly made up of our long-suffering family members.

In my two years here, we've done a few challenging works which have been definitely been more fun to sing than for the poor audience to listen to. So imagine our delight when this year we were presented with a piece published only in 2019 which not only (a) is in English, so the audience has a sporting chance of understanding the words and (b) retells the Christmas story, so the audience already has an idea what's going on, but it also includes some absolutely gorgeous, harmonious music that makes my soul sing as well as my vocal cords. I've played it in the car a little bit, and last week my wife Alice actually asked me to play it again – unheard of for a Calne Choral piece!

The reason I'm mentioning this is because it's an example of how the age old Christmas story of God coming among us is still inspiring people to retell, and reimagine, the story – even in the 21st century. The work is called Christmas Oratorio by Bob Chilcott and you can listen to it on Spotify or Amazon Music. Shameless plug: you could even come and hear it live on Sat 13th Dec at 7.30pm at St Mary's Church!

More unusually for a big Christmas work it includes the Magnificat – the words of Mary just after she's been visited by Archangel Gabriel. She proclaims the greatness of God, but also speaks of God

scattering the proud, casting down the mighty from their thrones, sending the rich away empty, while filling the hungry with good things and lifting up the lowly. It's a timely reminder that God is particularly interested in the people who have the least, and those society typically overlooks, or even looks down upon. Worth remembering as we approach Christmas with its temptation to over indulge. Is there a way we can share our abundance with those who have very little?

This Christmas season may God enable us to hear with fresh understanding the age-old story, the extraordinary good news, that God loved the world so much that he had to live among us in the person of his son Jesus Christ.

Let's Talk About Blood

Blood is a body fluid that delivers necessary substances such as nutrients and oxygen to the cells and transports metabolic waste products away from those same cells.



Blood is classified into different types based on ABO and Rh characteristics. From a blood donation point of view both O positive and O negative are really important for very different reasons.

O positive donors are really useful because anyone with an Rhpositive blood type, more than 70% of the population, can receive O positive.

More importantly though, everyone can receive O negative red blood cells. For this reason, O negative donors are often called "universal donors". Air ambulances and emergency response vehicles carry O negative red blood supplies for emergencies. Collecting enough O negative blood is a constant challenge since O negative blood types make up only about 8% of the population.

Right now the NHS Blood and Transplant centres need more blood donors. Medicines made from plasma save and transform the lives of over 17,000 people each year. Can you help?

The Sky at Night: December 2025 & January 2026

The long, cold nights of winter bring some of the year's finest stargazing. With clear air, bright planets and two major meteor showers, December and January offer plenty of reasons to step outside and look up.



December 2025 – Meteors and the Winter Stars

The month opens with the **Cold Moon** on **Thursday 4 December**, bathing the landscape in silvery light. Around **14 December**, the **Geminid meteor shower** peaks — one of the most reliable displays of the year, producing up to 100 shooting stars an hour under dark skies.

Meanwhile, **Jupiter** dominates the evening sky, gleaming high and bright. Even binoculars reveal its largest moons, while small telescopes show swirling cloud bands. The great winter constellations — **Orion**, **Taurus**, and the glittering **Pleiades** — now climb into view, painting the sky with some of the season's most recognisable patterns.

January 2026 - Jupiter at its Best

The new year begins with the **Wolf Moon** on **Saturday 3 January**, followed immediately by the **Quadrantid meteor shower**, peaking in the pre-dawn hours of **3–4 January**. Swift, bright meteors streak across the northern sky if the weather cooperates.

Around **10 January**, **Jupiter reaches opposition**, shining at its brightest and visible all night long — a perfect time to observe its moons and bands. **Saturn** lingers low in the southwest after sunset, while the **Orion Nebula** remains a stunning binocular target.

Stargazing Tips

- Avoid nights close to the full moon for darker skies.
- Let your eyes adjust for at least 10 minutes.
- Wrap up warm, bring a flask, and use a red torch to preserve night vision.



Book Club Review

Guilty by Definition by Susie Dent

This is an interesting and intriguing novel that you will enjoy if you are interested in language and word play. It is set in Oxford and the author's love and descriptions of this historic city provide an atmospheric backdrop to the story.

Martha Thornhill has returned from a decade in Berlin to take up the post of senior editor at the Clarendon English Dictionary in Oxford. When



an anonymous letter arrives, it becomes clear that this is not the usual lexicographical enquiry as the letter hints at secrets and lies linked to the summer Martha's brilliant older sister Charlie went missing.

Guilty by Definition is a novel that explores the use of language, the connection between words and how they can be used to reveal or cover up truths.

But it also is homage to language and it is sprinkled with the meaning and history of unusual words such as 'velleity' - the act of wishing or desiring, without any accompanying effort.


When more letters arrive, who better than Martha and her team of lexicographers to solve this murder mystery. They start to unravel the complex clues and discover that Charlie was keeping a powerful secret.

The novel explores the emotional aftermath of grief, and specifically the feelings of guilt and regret - and how Charlie's disappearance has impacted the family and those around them.

Overall, Derry Hill Book club enjoyed this novel though at times felt the delight in expanding and analysing words by the author interrupted the narrative and the flow of the story.

We enjoyed the various characters in Martha's team, especially the youngest member.

Wiltshire Youth Council

Schools are being asked to encourage 11-17-year-olds to stand for the next election, which takes place between Monday 2 and Friday 6 February 2026, with results announced the week commencing Monday 9 February 2026.

The deadline for school sign-up forms is Monday 8 December 2025.

Wiltshire Youth Councillors have the power to:

- meet with key decision-makers at Wiltshire Council to inform them about what young people find beneficial and what could be improved.
- consult with different services such as public health and transport.
- conduct youth inspections in schools to ensure pupil's experiences and views are heard.
- easily communicate with their peers, so young people's views are properly represented.

Youth councillors will be elected to a two-year term and will be asked to commit one evening per month to attend a full youth council meeting, which will focus on issues important to them.

They will also be expected to talk to their peers about issues and represent their views.

Scouting in Derry Hill and Studley

"The method of instruction in Scouting is that of creating in the young person the desire to learn for themselves."

Robert Baden-Powell founded Scouting 118 years ago as a way to get young people (girls were originally part of scouting, as they are again today!) to gain the life skills he felt were missing from their lives and schooling. In many ways nothing has really changed, and that quote means as much today as it did a century ago. At all ages scouting is about encouraging independent skills, self-reliance and the 'desire to learn'. Give a man a fish and he'll eat for a day, teach an 8-year-old Cub to light a fire and tie knots and there is no end to the fun and mischief they can create.

1st Derry Hill Scout Group currently has three very active sections that all meet at our hut on Old Road. Our **Beaver Lodge** for 6- to 8-year-olds meets on Tuesday nights 6-7pm; our **Cub Pack** for 8 to 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ year olds meets Thursdays 6.30-8pm; our **Scouts** for those 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ to 14 meet on a Wednesday, 7-8.30pm.

In the last couple of years our young people have been on a group camp in Somerset where activities included shooting, zip lining, tunnelling and tomahawk throwing. A PGL residential, and a train journey to London. Scouts have been scuba diving and climbing, while cubs and Beavers have learnt first aid skills, outdoor cooking and fire lighting and been on night hikes and sleep overs.

So far this term our Beavers are enjoying their move to the Scout Hut, now on a Tuesday evening, where they have been working towards the Disability Awareness and Communicator badges. The Beavers have also planted plots of daffodil bulbs in the hut grounds and look forward to seeing lots of spring colour.

Our Cub Pack is currently one of the biggest in the Mid-Wilts district with 31 members and they have had a busy term of learning Road Safety around the village, an international night of foods, games and languages from around the world, a Bonfire night Party and starting their Chef badges to create a meal.

The Scouts have spent almost every week out and about, either map reading, hiking, outdoor cooking or playing wide games like capture the flag and manhunt. Five Scouts achieved their Gold Award expeditions this term, hiking over 20 km in one of the days. With the changing weather we will be more inside but still regularly out on hikes and games in the dark!

All sections took part in November's Remembrance parade with an excellent turn out and all looked very smart. The Beavers made a wreath for the group and we donated money to RBL,
